Narrative Description of Indicator

States were not required to report actual target data for this indicator in the FFY 2008 (2008-2009) APR.

For FFY 2009 the IEPs of 19,086 out of 22,174 (86.10%) youth with disabilities aged 16 and above, included coordinated, measurable, annual IEP goals and transition services that will reasonably enable the student to meet the postsecondary go

Overview of Issue/Description of System or Process: The largest issue facing Maryland is the involvement of participatin Agencies. At the State level each of these agencies have referral and participation protocols. These protocols are the basi verification of the specific measurement concerning "Agency Invitation to IEP Team meetings." At the local level there are protocols and procedures that supersede the State protocols. Often when following the local protocols the local school sys appear non-compliant. Also local agency representatives do not want to be invited to IEP Team meetings.

Discussion of Baseline Data: There are 24 local school systems in Maryland along with 5 public education agencies. The d FFY 2009 is based on 22,174 students with IEPs.

The lowest school district was 34% compliant. The Indicator Measurements with the least compliance were:

- Evidence that the postsecondary goals were based on age appropriate transition assessments. 49% compliance
- Evidence that a representative of any participating agency was invited to the IEP Team meeting. 73% compliance

Improvement activities for FFY 2010 are focused on these two areas.

Maryland did not meet the target of 100% established by OSEP for this Indicator.
